English & Western Horse Show Rules and Regulations

1. All horses must be entered at the Secretary's Office or designated contact before showing commences.
2. All horses to enter Fairgrounds by East Gate.
3. All exhibitors are required to show proof of horse owner's liability insurance before exhibiting.
4. Anyone under the age of 18 **must** wear an ASTM approved helmet while mounted anywhere on the show grounds.
5. A horse may only be ridden by one rider per class.
6. Absolutely no abuse will be tolerated, at judge's discretion.
7. A horse may be deemed unfit to compete at judge's discretion. (ie-physical condition, behavior, etc.)
8. No interferences to the judge will be tolerated. Please direct all concerns to chairperson of the show committee.
9. Riders and company must pay admission at the gate.
10. All classes will run regardless of number of entries.
11. Any class specified as Western may only be ridden in Western tack. Any class specified as English may only be ridden in English tack. Classes marked 'English or Western' may be ridden in either or.

12. Tack should be well fitting and appropriate for type of class, at judge's discretion.
13. Show chairperson/judge reserves the right to alter any class, pattern or course due to unforeseen circumstances.
14. No stallions permitted.

An Open class is open to any age rider and horse.

Champion and Reserve Champion to be awarded to rider/horse combo with most amount of points in Western section, English section and total for whole day. No points awarded for Junior Fun Games.

High Point trophy to horse who receives most amount of points throughout the day.

Hunter classes judged on horse's movement, fluidity of performance, control, relaxation and consistency.

Equitation classes judged on rider's position, control and effective use of aids.

Pleasure classes judged on the horse. Horse must look like it is a pleasure to ride: smooth comfortable gaits, controlled on a loose rein and responds to invisible cues.

Equitation over fences classes may include: halts, roll-backs, bending lines, trot fences. Difficulty based on the level of the class.

Adults choosing to wear a helmet in Western classes will NOT be discriminated against.

Judging preference to proper discipline attire.

For all hunter and equitation over fences classes, 3 refusals total will be elimination.

It is highly recommended that all exhibitors fully vaccinate their horses and have a Coggins test taken regularly to improve protection of all equines on site.

Placings to 5th in all classes.

Prize money: 1st - \$25, 2nd - \$15, 3rd - \$5 (1st - \$100 for classes 6 & 20 only)

Points for champion, reserve champion and high point horse will be awarded as follows:

1st – 5pt 2nd – 4pt 3rd – 3pt 4th – 2pt 5th – 1pt

English & Western Horse Show Class Description

1. Open Showmanship - Western

Open to any age handler. In hand pattern class, shown in a halter. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day.

2. Open Western Pleasure - Western

Open to any age rider. Walk-Jog-Lope.

3. Open Horsemanship – Western

Open to any age rider. Walk-Jog-Lope. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day.

4. Open Trail Class – Western

Open to any age rider. Walk-Jog-Lope. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day. A class judged on the correct, prompt, clean and willing execution of each obstacle and overall pattern. May include such obstacles as: bridge, poles, tarp, backing, side passing, weaving, carrying something, gate, 360 turns, etc.

5. Open In Hand Extreme Obstacle Challenge – Western or English

Open to any age handler. An in hand class to be shown in a leather, nylon or rope halter or English bridle. Saddles on or off at discretion of handler. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day. A class judged similar to an In Hand Trail Class (correct, prompt, clean, willing execution of each obstacle and overall pattern) with a little more extreme obstacles. There will be a pattern posted of obstacles, but no posted gaits. Handlers may walk or jog/trot in between and through obstacles to increase difficulty. After 2 failed attempts must move on to next obstacle. May include such obstacles as: bridge, poles, tarp, backing, side passing, weaving, carrying something, gate, 360 turns, very small jump, skinny bridge, distractions, etc.

6. Open Mounted Extreme Obstacle Challenge – Western or English

Open to any age rider. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day. This is not a speed class. A class judged similar to a Trail Class (correct, prompt, clean, willing execution of each obstacle and overall pattern) with a little more extreme obstacles. There will be a pattern posted of obstacles, but no posted gaits therefore it is open to all riders including Walk/Trot riders. Riders may walk, jog/trot or lope/canter in between and through obstacles to increase difficulty. After 2 failed attempts must move on to next obstacle. May include such obstacles as: bridge, poles, tarp, backing, side passing, weaving, carrying something, gate, 360 turns, very small jump, skinny bridge, distractions, dismount, etc. A \$100 payout for 1st place! No change in entry fee. Regular prize money paid to remaining placings.

7. Open Command – Western or English

Open to any age rider. Walk-Trot/Jog-Canter/Lope. Control is the key in this class. The judge will provide commands and they must be followed immediately and correctly or the rider will be eliminated. The last rider on the rail wins the class.

8. Leadline – Western or English – No Charge

Walk only. Must be lead by capable handler. Open to riders under the age of 12 as of the day of the show. Goal is to have fun. Rider must be able to sit unassisted. Rider cannot compete in any other mounted classes besides 11, 12, 13.

9. Open Walk/Trot Pleasure – Western or English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Horse/rider combo cannot compete in any other mounted classes besides 6, 10, 16, 17 (Junior riders also classes 11, 12, 13).

10. Open Walk/Trot Equitation – Western or English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Rail class. Horse/rider combo cannot compete in any other mounted classes besides 6, 9, 16, 17 (Junior riders also classes 11, 12, 13).

11. Junior Fun Games: Sit A Buck W/T with saddle – Western or English

Open to any rider under the age of 18 as of the day of the show. Walk-Trot/Jog. May be lead or ride unassisted. This class is performed with a saddle, not bareback. Each rider will be given a small piece of paper to place between their leg and the saddle, or where judge sees fit. The judge will provide various walk, trot/jog commands and the last rider with the paper remaining will win the class. Riders may also compete in classes 12, 13 and the Leadline OR the Walk/Trot classes (Class 6,9,10,16,17) but no other mounted classes. Entry fee only \$4.00

12. Junior Fun Games: Egg & Spoon W/T – Western or English

Open to any rider under the age of 18 as of the day of the show. Walk-Trot/Jog. May be lead or ride unassisted. Each rider will be given an “egg” (golf ball) on a spoon to hold. The judge will provide various walk, trot/jog commands and the last rider with the “egg” remaining on the spoon will win the class. Riders may also compete in classes 11, 13 and the Leadline OR the Walk/Trot classes (Class 6,9,10,16,17) but no other mounted classes. Entry fee only \$4.00

13. Junior Fun Games: Obstacle Course – Western or English

Open to any rider under the age of 18 as of the day of the show. Pattern will be posted at beginning of day. May be lead or ride unassisted. Pattern will be simple and no gait posted so rider may choose to walk or trot/jog to increase difficulty. May include such obstacles as weaving, walk through L poles, halt, back up. Judged on correct, prompt, clean, willing execution of each obstacle and overall pattern. Riders may also compete in classes 11, 12 and the Leadline OR the Walk/Trot classes (Class 6,9,10,16,17) but no other mounted classes. Entry fee only \$4.00

14. Open Hunter Under Saddle – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Walk-Trot-Canter.

15. Open Equitation on the Flat – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Walk-Trot-Canter. Rail class.

16. Open Cross Rails Hunter Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. May trot or canter jumping courses. Horse/rider combo may not compete in any other jumping classes besides 17. A course of 4 cross rails. Will be a warm-up available over jumps.

17. Open Cross Rails Equitation Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. May trot or canter jumping courses. Horse/rider combo may not compete in any other jumping classes besides 16. A course of 4 cross rails. Will be a warm-up available over jumps.

18. Open 2' Hunter Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Stride will be set on a horse stride and will not be adjusted. A course of 6 jumps no bigger than 2'. Warm up will be available only if time permits.

19. Open 2' Equitation Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Stride will be set on a horse stride and will not be adjusted. A course of 6 jumps no bigger than 2'. Warm up will be available only if time permits.

20. Open 2'6" Hunter Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Stride will be set on a horse stride and will not be adjusted. A course of 8 jumps no bigger than 2'6". Warm up will be available only if time permits.

21. Open 2'6" Equitation Over Fences – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. Stride will be set on a horse stride and will not be adjusted. A course of 8 jumps no bigger than 2'6". Warm up will be available only if time permits.

22. Open Hunter Derby Stake – English

Open to any age rider on a horse or pony. A class designed to be reminiscent of the hunt field rewarding jumping style, a flowing, steady pace, boldness, athleticism and scope. This class consists of two separate rounds: 1) Classic Round – 6 jumps judged on performance, pace, jumping style, quality and movement. 2) Handy Hunter Round – 6 jumps judged on a more forward pace, opting for tighter turns, unique jump approaches and more challenging options. The two round scores will be added together for final placings. Class runs at two heights: 2' and 2'6" in which rider may choose which height to compete at. If horse/rider combo are competing in class 19, they may not choose the 2' option. Not open to cross rail rider/horse combos. Formal attire not required. May include traditional hunter jumps, natural jumps and handy options such as broken lines, inside turns, etc. A \$100 payout for 1st place! No change in entry fee. Regular prize money paid to remaining placings. No warm up, but some jumps will be the same as previous jumping classes.
