

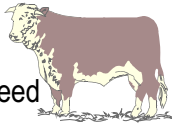

General Rules see website for Prize Money, General Rules, Code of Ethics, Code Enforcement, Entry Form



1. Proof of Liability Insurance must accompany each entry form for the animals being shown.
2. Entries close 1 week prior to show date of the current year. Late entries will be accepted until 11:00 a.m. the day of the showing.
3. Each breed must have at least 3 exhibitors per breed. Angus, Other Breeds/Crossbreed exempt for 2019. If these qualifications are not met, only half of the prize money will be awarded.
4. All prize money will be paid by cheque, as soon as possible. Class 4, 8, 11, 14, 15 & 16 Ribbons /Banners only, no prize money. All cheques must be cashed before Dec. 1 of current fair year.
5. Entry fee will be 20%+HST of winnings, and a \$7.00 membership fee. Late entry fee is an additional 5% of prize money awarded.
6. Cattle must not be removed before 4 p.m. and until all shows are complete the day of the show.
7. Each cattle exhibitor to receive one pass for 1- 4, 5-8, 9-10 animals upon receipt of entry form. 2 tie stalls will be supplied for prep/storage if available. One animal, one tie ring. Maintain 4 foot walkway. No excess hay/straw beyond your prep/storage area. No feed/straw provided.

Special NOTES:

1. Breeds will be alternated in the beef ring(s)
2. All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person are considered to be the production of the farm or breeding unit.
3. Each breeding unit is allowed a maximum of 10 exhibits excluding the Breeder's Herd and Get-of-Sire classes. All exhibits must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.
4. All animals being shown in single classes must be registered, except Other Breed/Crossbreed, at the time of the entries' closing. All animals must possess intact and undamaged CFIA approved tag.
5. Breeders Herd and Get-of-Sire - animals and papers will be checked before entering the ring.
6. The Canadian Hereford and the Ontario Hereford Associations have banned aerosols. This will also apply to the Simmental, Angus, Other Breed/Crossbreed Shows

Class

1. MALE - calf born on or after January 1, 2019, minimum 3 months of age on show day.
2. MALE - Yearling Junior born January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018
3. MALE - Yearling Senior born January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017
4. SPECIAL - Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Male
5. FEMALE - Calf born on or after January 1, 2019, minimum 3 months of age on show day.
6. FEMALE - Heifer Junior born March 1, 2018 to December 31, 2018 (Junior)
7. FEMALE - Heifer Senior born January 1, 2018 to February 28, 2018 (Senior)
8. FEMALE - born January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 with her own 2019, natural purebred registered calf at foot.
9. FEMALE - born prior to January 1, 2017, with her own 2019 natural purebred registered calf at foot. Calf can only be shown with mother and in Class 8 & 9.
10. BREEDER'S HERD - A group of four (4) animals bred by the exhibitor, both sexes represented, must be exhibited in previous classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Limited to one exhibit per exhibitor.
11. Get-of-Sire - 3 animals from the same sire, both sexes represented, at least one owned by the exhibitor, limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. Will need papers for this class.
12. Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Female.
13. Progeny of Dam
14. Premier Breeder. GC from Pizza Hut, Cornwall
15. Premier Exhibitor. Billy K, Cornwall

NOTE: All Exhibitors are required to have their own Liability Insurance. Each cattle exhibitor to receive one pass for 1- 4, 5-8, 9-12, 13-15 animals upon receipt of entry form.

GENERAL RULES

All cheques to be cashed by December 1st of current fair year or they will be null and void.

Maximum PRIZE MONEY SCHEDULE FOR CLASSES

1st - \$ 60.00; 2nd - \$ 50.00; 3rd - \$ 45.00; 4th - \$ 35.00; 5th - \$ 30.00; 6th - \$ 25.00; 7th - \$ 20.00
Any class without full sponsorship- prize \$ will be pro-rated, not exceeding regular prize \$.

- 1. All must exhibitors must submit signed entry forms to:** Stormont Agricultural Society Secretary.
- All Animals must be on grounds by 10:00 a.m. on day of show.
- All Exhibitors must be Members of the Fair.
- All prize money will be by cheque as soon as possible.
- The calculation of Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder points per exhibitor and per breeder will be assessed on a maximum of ten (10) animals shown and earning most points in the individual classes. If a tie occurs and prize cannot be split then Exhibitor or Breeder (as applies) with highest number of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, highest total number of entries shown.
Premier Exhibitor - An award will be presented to the exhibitor / owner (individual, partnership or institution) with the most points for animals owned and shown by the exhibitor, based on their highest seven (7) placings in the individual classes. All animals accumulating points for this award must be the entries of one exhibitor. Points will be awarded on the following basis: 1st 7; 2nd 6; 3rd 5; 4th 4; 5th 3 6th 2, 7th 1
Premier Breeder - An award will be presented to the individual or company (as recorded on the Certificate of Registration) whose animals accumulate the highest total points based on their highest seven (7) placings in individual classes. To be eligible for the Premier Breeder Award, the breeder must exhibit at the show. Joint breeders are separate entries and will be awarded separate points. Qualification for this award is based on Canadian rules that specify all owners at the time of conception are the breeders of the animals. Points will be awarded on the following basis: 1st 7; 2nd 6; 3rd 5; 4th 4; 5th 3, 6th 2, 7th 1.
- 6. NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS USING THE CATTLE BARN.** The cattle barn will be open Saturday, of the fair at 9:00 p.m. No stalls reserved. **2 tie stalls will be supplied for prep/storage if available.** One animal, one tie ring. **Maintain 4 foot walkway. No excess hay/straw beyond your prep/storage area. No feed/straw provided.** This applies to all breeds. These rules will be strictly enforced.
- 7. HEALTH REGULATIONS:** Animals showing signs of contagious disease or parasitic infections - IE. - ringworm IBR, lice - will not be allowed on the grounds. Any and all Veterinary notes addressing the aforementioned rule must be dated within 5 days of the show.
- 8. A) All livestock (Dairy / beef cattle, sheep , bison or pigs) must possess the approved (intact and undamaged) CFIA or PIGTRACE tag or identifier in order to enter the fairgrounds. No tag, NO ENTRY.**
B) If a tag is lost while at the fair, the owner or exhibitor is responsible for applying the tag and ensuring that it is done in a safe manner. Agricultural Society staff or volunteers **MUST NOT apply or assist in applying the tag.** Furthermore, the Agricultural Society is not responsible for providing the pliers to apply the tag or facilities to restrain the animal while the owner/exhibitor applies the tag.

CODE OF ETHICS FOR ALL CATTLE EXHIBITORS

The following practices of procedures are considered unacceptable and defined as unethical in the show ring of registered dairy cattle.

Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.

1. Filling an animal's rumen unnaturally with liquid (tubing); Balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters.
2. Treating or massaging any part of the animal's body particularly the udder, internally or externally with an irritant, counterirritant or other substances to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation.
3. Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves.
4. Insertion of foreign material under skin, into the topline (including hair not attached to its own hair follicle);
5. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or other conduct detrimental to the breed or show.
6. A) No filling or tubing an animal unnaturally with liquid. B) No epidural anaesthesia (blocking tails), C) No roping udders, and D) no wrapping hocks without veterinarian authorization.
7. Excessive manipulation of hair beyond 1.5 inches from the skin.

ENFORCEMENT OF CODE

Exhibitors were encouraged to correct problems identified, by the honour system rather than have regulations imposed by someone outside the Holstein Fraternity. Enforcement procedures to be reviewed after one year's trial of the honour system. As adopted September, 1981 by Board of Directors, Holstein Canada and updated as needed.

ALL CATTLE EXHIBITORS

1. The provisions of this part apply to entries of a breed regulated by a breed association which has adopted this part.
2. No exhibitor and no agent, employee or other person acting on behalf of an exhibitor will have in his or her possession or control: a) any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device. b) swabs, cloth or other material, or c) any medicine preparation or substance; whether in liquid or any other form intended for use in contravention of the Code of Ethics.
3. In addition to the requirements of the general rules and regulations, all entries and the personal property of all exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection at all times by Inspectors authorized by the General Manager. All such persons will cooperate with the Inspectors and will provide all such information in connection with such inspections and will provide, if so requested, samples of urine and blood suitable for analysis. They will also remove any udder supports, blankets or other objects limiting the ability of the Inspector to undertake a thorough inspection of the animals. In particular, the Inspectors will be informed of the nature of any medicine, treatment or substance administered to any entry and the reasons therefore.
4. Any Inspector may at any time require the delivery to him/her of any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloth or other material, or samples of any medicine, preparation or substance whether in liquid or other form in the possession or control of the exhibitor, his servants, agents or persons acting on behalf of the exhibitor for the purposes of laboratory analysis.
- 5a). Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (b), the following entries are disqualified and will not participate further in the Fair in which the entry is disqualified.
 - (1). Any animal determined by an Inspector (who is also a veterinarian) to have any udder manifesting any of the following: localized swelling, edema, erythema, sensitivity, reddening,

firmness, warmth or exfoliation of the skin, but excluding general edema associated with parturition or mastitis or a sore in the area where the large blood vessels enter the udder.

- (2). Any animal entered by an exhibitor who or whose servants, agents or persons acting on behalf of the exhibitor, fails to cooperate in the inspections provided for under paragraphs 3 or 4.
 - b) The Inspector's determination pursuant to subparagraph (a) (1) is subject to an appeal by the exhibitor to the Appeal Committee appointed by the Executive Committee for the purpose. Any such appeal must be made by notice in writing delivered to either General Manager or General Superintendent within one hour.
6. No entry will be removed from the Fair buildings prior to being exhibited for any purpose, except upon the express permission of the General Manager and under supervision while absent from the Fair buildings and any entry removed without such permission will be disqualified.
 7. Champion Classes – only animals shown in previous class at the current show are eligible.
 8. ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A PLASTIC NLID (DAIRY/BEEF) TAG IN ORDER TO BE EXHIBITED!! NO EXCEPTIONS!
 9. AGREEMENT(Enclosed)FORM REGARDING COMPLIANCE TO THE CODE OF ETHICS PRIOR TO EXHIBITING AN ANIMAL OR ANIMALS for Exhibitors/Owners/Fitters.

Stormont Agricultural Society RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Every Exhibitor or Competitor must become a Member of the Society** and pay the sum of seven dollars (\$7.00). This fee only entitles the holder to exhibit at the Fair and enables the exhibitor to remove their exhibits on Monday of the Fair after 4:00 p.m. only. **All volunteers are encouraged to maintain society membership** which in turn provides insurance coverage for SAS work/volunteering. **Membership fee \$7.00(No HST), \$8.00 for 2020.**
2. Any competitor having obtained a Prize by willful or corrupt means, fraud or misrepresentation, will forfeit all prize money for the year.
3. When there is only one competitor or when the animal or article is not deserving of a prize it will be left to the discretion of the Judges to award 1st, 2nd, 3rd or no prize at all.
4. Any member or agent who interferes with the Judges in any way by pointing out his or her property, will forfeit their prizes for that year.
5. All protests against the decision of the Judges must be made before the close of the exhibition and must be delivered to the Secretary in writing, stating the cause of the protest, accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00, which will be returned if protest is carried. Any difficulty in respect to the awarding of prizes in any of the departments will be referred to the proper Committee over that Department, who will have power to hear all disputes and report their decision upon the same to the Board of Directors, which, if approved of, will be the final settlement of all protest.
6. The Directors will have a right to deduct a further percentage of the prizes should the funds be insufficient to pay them in full.
7. Winners of gift certificates, check with the Secretary, so you can pick these up in the office.
8. While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of articles on exhibition, they wish it to be distinctly understood that the owners themselves must take the risk of articles being stolen; the Directors will give all assistance in their power toward the recovery of the same but will not make any payment for the value thereof.
9. The Society will not be responsible for any accidents on the grounds.
10. Anyone caught trying to enter the Fair Grounds without paying could be charged with trespassing and fined up to \$100.00 or more. **No Alcohol on site except in designated area(s). No campfires onsite. No Drugs onsite.**
11. The Electrical Safety Code of Ontario requires that all electrical equipment must be approved before it may be lawfully advertised, displayed, offered for sale, sold or otherwise disposed of used in the Province of Ontario. It is therefore the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that all electrical

equipment in, or about, their booth comply with the above regulations. This includes the electrical merchandise as well as lighting and display equipment. Should any of this equipment not conform, it is recommended that you request temporary permission to exhibit while the necessary approval certification is being sought. Please write directly to the appropriate inspection department for this area. Any questions concerning regulation for booth wiring should be addressed to the appropriate electrical supplier. Failure of Electrical equipment to comply with the safety code requirements can result in the equipment being refused connection to the source of electrical supply and it may even be ordered removed from the display.

12. All exhibitors/concessions are requested to comply with the Ontario Fire Code. Fire routes are not to be obstructed. Maintain 4 foot walkways. Access to doorways and electrical panels are not to be obstructed. Appropriate extinguishers are to be maintained. Any combustible/ hazardous items are to conform to the proper code and handled with the appropriate care. No fires are allowed on site.

13. The SAS respects the privacy of its members, exhibitors, sponsors and volunteers. The information you provide will be used to maintain a membership database. Information from entries forms and/or photos/video may be used to create show catalogues and to publish show results in the newspapers and/or forwarded to the appropriate sponsors as specifically requested. Any member, exhibitor, commercial exhibitor, sponsor or director realizes that when they agree to take part in the Stormont Agricultural Society and the Stormont County Fair, that their names may be published for those reasons only. None of this information whatsoever will be sold or transferred to any outside party for any reason. If this is not acceptable, please contact the fair secretary.

14. All agricultural products MUST be grown by the Exhibitor and grown within the year, unless otherwise stated. All articles of domestic manufacture will be domestic manufacture weaving, tulling and dyeing.

15. All agricultural implements may be exhibited by agents or manufacturers or farmers. No prize awarded by the Society.

16. All articles for exhibition in Sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25 are to be in their proper place in the Hall at 11:30 a.m. on Friday of Stormont County Fair and to be judged that day; and all animals and implements in Section 8 by 8:30; 7, 9, 10, 11, 12 by 9:30 am, Beef by 10:00 a.m. on the show grounds of the respective show day of the Stormont County Fair and be judged that day; no animals or articles to be removed from the grounds on the show day(s) until permission is granted by the Superintendent in charge.

17. All persons exhibiting in Cattle, Beef, Heavy Horse classes MUST have entries in no later than 2 weeks pre-show day. Light Horse classes no later than 7 days pre-show. Western Gaming classes no later than 4 days pre-show. Cattle (Holstein, Jersey and Ayrshire) will use Assist Expo for entry information. See website for further info. **All exhibitors must submit signed entry form** and payment if required, to appropriate person listed on the entry form.

18. No animal may be entered in two separate classes, except for a special prize or diploma; but Exhibitors of Registered Livestock may be awarded any one prize if entitled to it in the same section of classes.

19. All animals must be registered in the name of the Exhibitor before closing date of entries. Persons exhibiting Pure Bred stock must give their names and numbers to the Superintendent at the time of judging. Exception in the Light Horse Section.

20. If there are not (3) three exhibitors in the dairy or beef classes (Other Breed/Crossbreed exempt for 2019), the Society is under no obligation to pay the full prize money listed. Dairy - a minimum of 24 head or prize money is paid out at half. Beef payout is prorated to available monies.

21. SAS is not responsible for any diseases or their spread. (Animal and/or human.)

22. All horses in any class can be shown single or double in the class to which they belong.

23. Each cattle exhibitor to receive one pass for 1- 4, 5-8, 9-12, 13-15 animals. Horse exhibitors to receive one pass for every two horses. No feed/straw provided. No milking parlour available.

24. No Campers unless approved by SAS. Fee \$25/day or \$100/weekend. Departure 11a.m.
