

Terms and Conditions

Indoor Space- Silver Peaks hours: 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Saturday, Sunday, Monday. Setup at 8am. Open to public 9am Sat.&Mon. Subject to change.

Outdoor Space- Fri Evening, Sat, Sun, Mon.

Concessionaires must provide their own security and provide proof that insurance/appropriate compliance certificates are current.

All Food vendors must be in compliance with current Health & Safety Codes, provide a "Kitchen Report".

1. The Stormont Agricultural Society reserves the right to accept or reject any exhibit. Spaces will be confirmed upon receipt of payment accompanied by a \$2M Certificate of Liability Insurance (see options attached) naming the Stormont Agricultural Society as an additional insured.
2. Each Concession will receive one (1) weekend pass (gate admission only). Additional passes are available per current pricing.
3. Chair/table can be requested but will be 1st come/1st served as available for indoor use only.
4. Electrical outlets are limited; please indicate on your application if you require electricity and, although power cannot be guaranteed, the committee will do its best to provide the service. Exhibitors are responsible for providing their extension cords. Generators can only be used outdoors if needed and be safely operated at all times without excessive noise/emissions. All vendors are responsible for plugging in their own pre-paid, hydro / extension cords, and are responsible for any equipment failure or damage done from an improper connection. A SAS person must allow access to the panel.

Anyone who disconnects or reconnects another vender's power may be removed from the Fairgrounds without compensation and will become liable, financially and legally for any malfunction that it may cause to another vendor or fairground property and loss of revenue.

The Electrical Safety Code of Ontario requires that all electrical equipment must be approved before it may be lawfully advertised, displayed, offered for sale, sold or otherwise disposed of used in the Province of Ontario. It is therefore the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that all electrical equipment in, or about, their booth comply with the above regulations. This includes the electrical merchandise as well as lighting and display equipment. Should any of this equipment not conform, it is recommended that you request temporary permission to exhibit while the necessary approval certification is being sought. Please write directly to the appropriate inspection department for this area. Any questions concerning regulation for booth wiring should be addressed to the appropriate electrical supplier. Failure of Electrical equipment to comply with the safety code requirements can result in the equipment being refused connection to the source of electrical supply and it may even be ordered removed from the display.

5. All articles for sale must be clearly marked.
6. Based on the information provided in the application, the Stormont Agricultural Society will make every effort to ensure that no two vendors of the same nature are located beside each other.
7. NO LASER PINS, LASER LIGHTS OR KNIVES allowed on the fairgrounds. These products are banned and their sale will not be permitted.
8. Vendors must not damage or deface any part of the fairgrounds or its buildings.
9. A concessions must be manned at all times by their vendors or other qualified representatives. Vacant booths may be closed by committee members.
10. Every precaution will be taken to protect your property; however, the Stormont Agricultural Society cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss of goods brought on the fairgrounds.
11. All vendors must adhere to public health and safety guidelines, including any COVID-19 requirements.
12. All exhibitors/concessions are requested to comply with the Ontario Fire Code. Fire routes are not to be obstructed. Access to doorways and electrical panels are not to be obstructed. Appropriate extinguishers are to be maintained. Any combustible/hazardous items are to conform to the proper code and handled with the appropriate care.
13. The SAS respects the privacy of its members, exhibitors, sponsors and volunteers. The information you provide will be used to maintain a membership database. Information from entries forms and/or photos/video may be used to create show catalogues and to publish show results in the newspapers and/or forwarded to the appropriate sponsors as specifically requested. Any member, exhibitor, commercial exhibitor, sponsor or director realizes that when they agree to take part in the Stormont Agricultural Society and the Stormont County Fair, that their names may be published for those reasons only. None of this information whatsoever will be sold or transferred to any outside party for any reason.
14. Upon Acceptance of your application, the terms and conditions noted herein become part of the agreement between you, the exhibitor, and the Stormont Agricultural Society.

CERTIFICATE OF LIABILITY INSURANCE

The Stormont Agricultural Society insurance policy does not extend coverage to any exhibits and requires all vendors to submit a Certificate of Insurance.

You must have adequate liability insurance with a minimum \$2M coverage to protect the exhibitors, the attendees, the show organizers and yourself.

Option A: SINGLE EVENT INSURANCE: We recommend using Duuo Insurance <https://duuo.ca/vender-insurance/>.

Option B: YOUR OWN INSURANCE COMPANY

You can have your insurance company prepare a Certificate of Insurance which must have the following:
